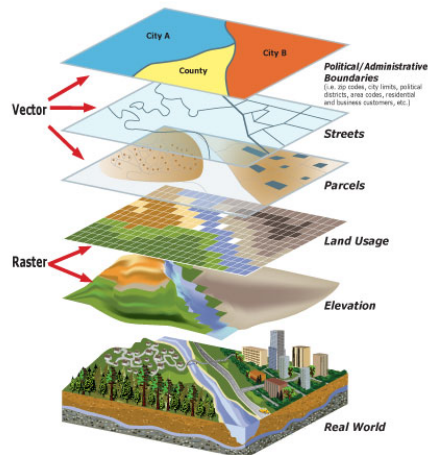
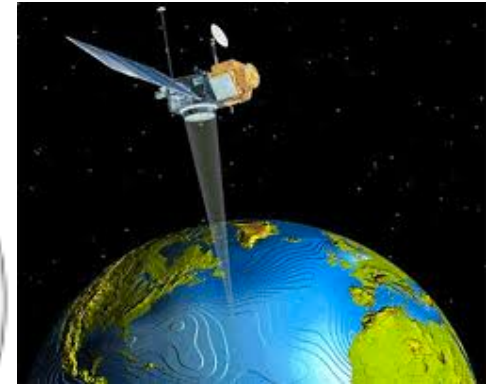

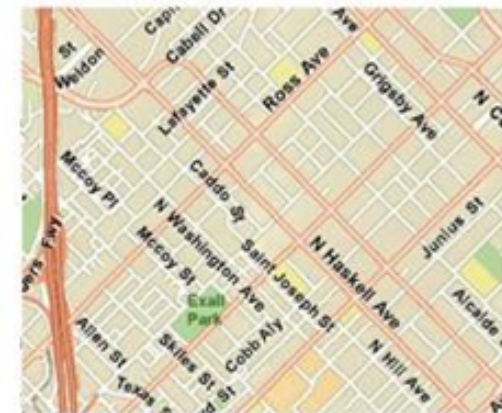

Original Extent / Small Scale Map



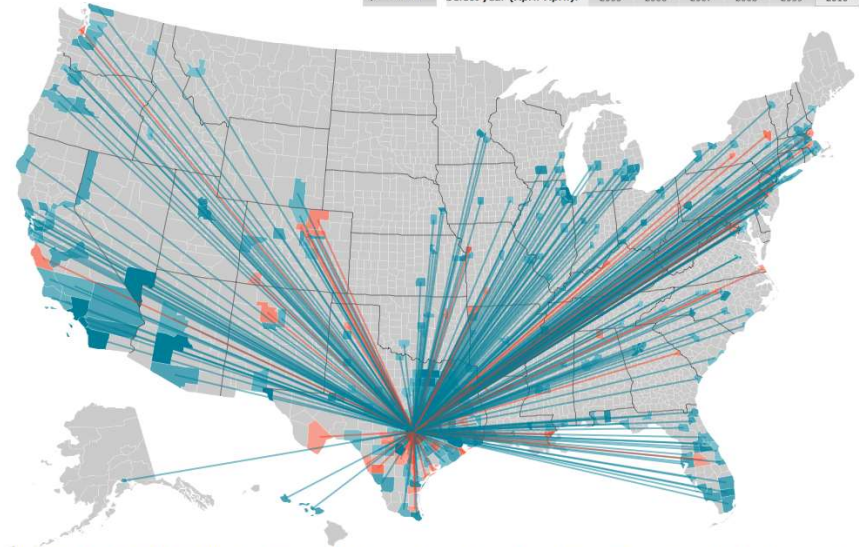
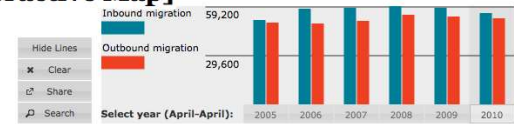

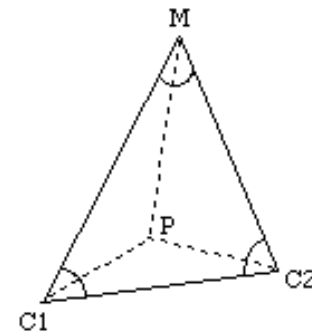
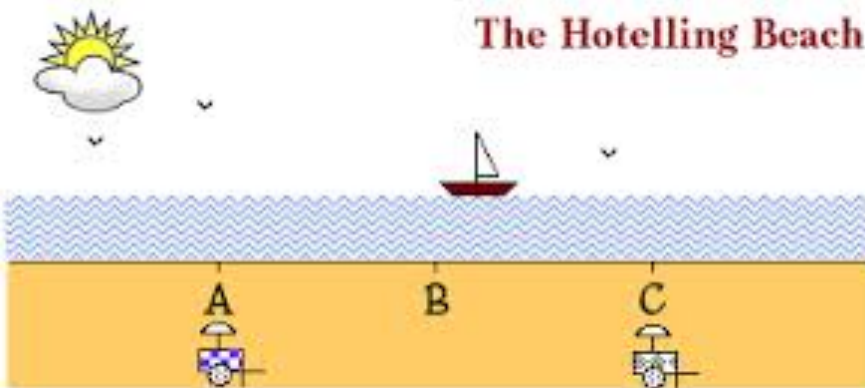
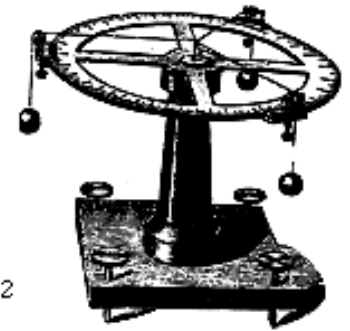


Fig. 1 locational triangle Fig.2 Varignon frame (Weber 1929: 229)

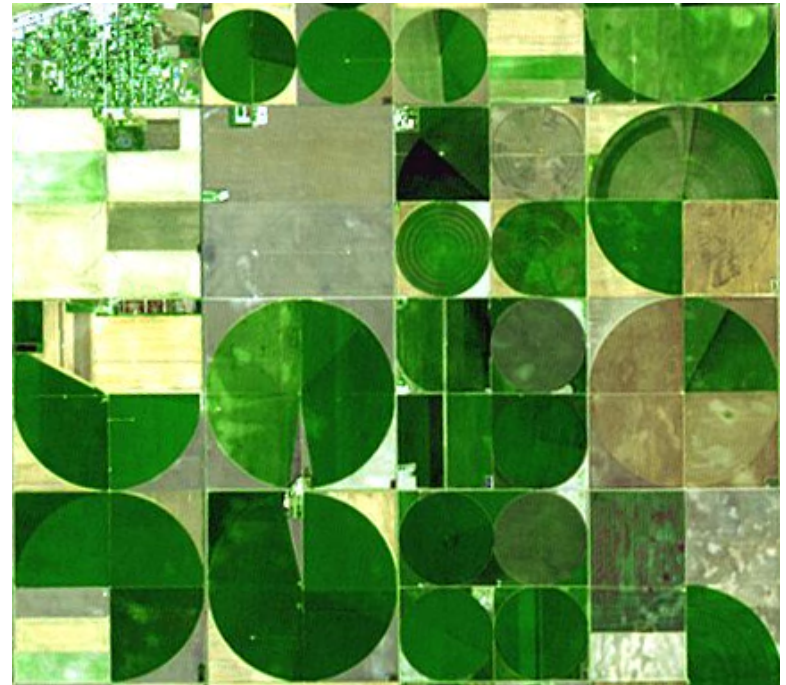

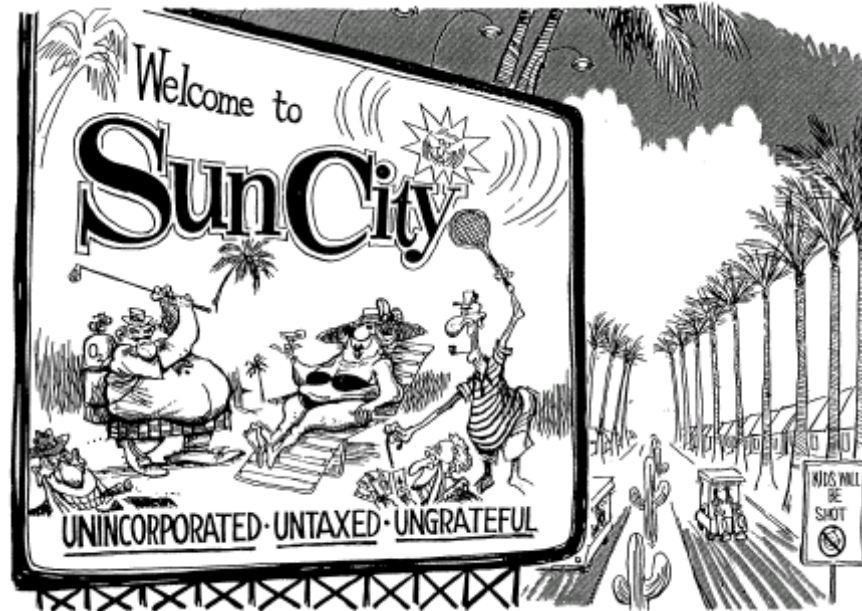

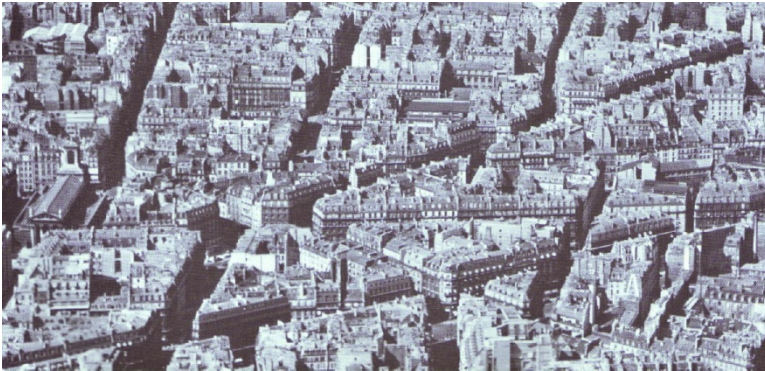
